

Industry-recognized quality

P.H. Tech's story goes as follows...

1962

"Quincaillerie Panoramique Inc." came into existence. Its owners had a strong desire to create and market a new type of window which could satisfy the ever-growing needs of builders, architects and all building specialists. A new material seemed to meet all of the companies' requirements: extruded PVC.

1965

"Quincaillerie Panoramique Inc." became "Plastiques P.H." and began the production of its own PVC profiles.

1976

"Plastiques P.H." became P.H. Tech Inc. (Panoramic Hardware). In an expansion project of over one million dollars, several silos and an automatic material handling system were incorporated into the company.

1978-1979

New line of "Conservation" products and introduction of the Vice-Versa PH-600 sliding door.

1980

Vinyl window products were recognized by the CSA (Canadian Standards Association).

1987-1988

The PH-900 window system was recognized by the CMHC as conforming to the CAN3-A440-M84 standard and received a European technical approval from the CSTB (Centre scientifique et technique du bâtiment de la France). Launch of the first all-PVC window in Canada, the series 2000 of the System Boréal line. P.H. Tech opened a sales office and a warehouse in Maryland to better suit the United States market.

1995-1996

The new series 3000 (3 1/4") and 4000 (4 9/16") from the Boréal line were launched. A wood/PVC patio door S-700 and an all-PVC patio door S-7000 were put on the market in order to satisfy the new and reviewed norms established by the building codes in 1995.

1997-1998

PH products met the NFRC (National Fenestration Rating Council) Certification Program requirements. During that same period, the company participated in the elaboration of the new harmonized North American standards NAFS (North American Fenestration Standard).

2001-2002

P.H. Tech Inc became the first extruder to successfully pass the extremely rigorous tests of the Miami-Dade impact testing. Launch of the all-PVC robust entrance door as well as the Primera line of windows.

2004

Plant expansion and implementation of a new computer management system. Reception of the C-TPAT certification (Customs-Trade Partnership Against Terrorism). Opening of a patio door assembly plant and a distribution centre in Leetsdale, PA.

2007

P.H. Tech celebrated 45 years in business and became the second largest window and door extruder in Canada.

one goal was for PH products to reach international stature: in 1962, products were exported to England, then to France in 1965, following with Holland in 1966, the United States in 1971, and finally Japan in 1999.
